**Adopting Revised Burnett County Code of Ordinances Sec. 18-71. – Disposition of
Abandoned Personal Property**

- 1 Sec. 18-71. - Disposition of abandoned personal property.
2 (a) Abandoned personal property which has been in the possession of the county for a period of
3 more than 30 days may be disposed of by the county by public auction, private sale, or other
4 means of disposal deemed to be in the best interest of the county by ~~unanimous~~ decision of
5 the county administration committee.
6 (b) Any disposition of abandoned personal property not completed by public sale shall require
7 the county to maintain an inventory of said property, recording the date and method of
8 disposal, the consideration received for the property, and the name and address of the person
9 taking possession of the property. This inventory shall be kept as a public record for a period
10 of two years from the date of disposal of said property.
